

RESOLUTION #279-B

A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of Mohave County, State of Arizona, establishing a Civil Defense organization.

The office of Director of Civil Defense is hereby created, the Director shall be appointed and serve at the will of the Board of Supervisors of Mohave County, Arizona.

The duties of the Director of Civil Defense shall include the following.

1. The recommendation for adoption by the Board of Supervisors of a civil defense plan.
2. The maintenance of necessary liaison between the Board of Supervisors and the Civil Defense Organization and with other civil defense organization.
3. The control and direction of the training of the civil defense organization.
4. Such other duties as prescribed by law or by regulation adopted by the Board of Supervisors.

The Civil Defense Organization of the County of Mohave, State of Arizona, shall consist of the officers and employees of the County of Mohave designated by regulations, as well as, all volunteer defense workers. The functions and duties of the organization shall be distributed between such divisions and services as shall be prescribed by regulation of the Board of Supervisors.

It shall be unlawful for any person to wilfully obstruct, hinder or delay any member of the civil defense organization in carrying out his duties under this Resolution. It shall also be unlawful for any person to wear, carry or display any emblem, insignia or other means of identification as a member of the civil defense organization of the County of Mohave unless so authorized by the proper officials. Convictions for violations shall be punishable by imprisonment for 30 days in the County Jail or fine not in excess of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.


If any portion of this ordinance shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions hereof.

Whereas, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the County of Mohave that this Resolution become immediately effective, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
